



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ON VACANT POST APPLICATION

1. What are the types of job advertisement regulations under the Public Service Commission Act?

Regulation 7 (a) - job application is open to public and those serving in the civil service of Brunei Darussalam.

Regulation 38 (a) - job application is only open to those who are currently serving in the civil service of Brunei Darussalam.

Regulation 38 (b) - job application is only open to those who are currently serving in the department/ministry where the vacancy is advertised.

2. Are those serving in the daily paid schemes eligible to apply for vacant posts under regulation of 38 (A) and (B)?

Those serving in daily paid schemes are only eligible to apply advertisements under Regulation 7(a).

3. Can users still apply vacant post advertisements that has passed the deadline?

Users can only view and apply ongoing advertisements.

4. Will the job applications made through previous PSCR be carried forward to the PSCR 2.0?

Previous applications will not be reflected in the new PSCR 2.0. However, status updates can be viewed through PSC website www.spa.gov.bn in the "Status Permohonan" page. Alternatively, users can also contact the PSC Helpline via WhatsApp +673 7371961 or email query@spa.gov.bn.

5. How do I keep track on the progress of my applications?

During the phase one, application status is only partially functional. However, status updates can be viewed through PSC website www.spa.gov.bn in the "Status Permohonan" page.

NOTES

Regulation 38(a) and (b) advertisements are only viewable for civil servants. While Regulation 7(a) advertisements are viewable for both civil servants and the public.
